A MESSAGE

from Langham Partnership Australia CEO

A significant part of our role as Langham Partnership Australia is raising awareness of what God is doing through the global organisation to grow and mature His Church. Many of us here in Australia are under the impression that the Church is shrinking and under pressure to remain relevant in an increasingly secularised world.

While this may be true of many churches in the West, it is not the experience of many of our brothers and sisters in the Majority World, who see the Church expanding rapidly through the witness and teaching of faithful followers of Jesus, and who are actively providing salt and light to a people that are searching for meaning and purpose in their lives. The Muslim world in particular is seeing many come to Christ, despite the persecution that often comes their way as a result. In this context it is vital that the new believers are well supported, with faithful, clear and relevant Bible teaching to help them mature in their faith. Through trained pastors and leaders, who have access to high quality, contextually relevant resources, Langham is seeking to partner with the Church in the Majority World to see the Church grow in depth as well as size.

Of course alongside raising awareness, we have as our primary purpose the raising of funds here in Australia to enable this work to continue and expand. We are immensely grateful to our faithful supporters who join with us in this work, many of whom give regularly and sacrificially as they see the strategic importance of equipping the next generation of Bible teachers. Thank you for your partnership with us, through prayer and financial support, and helping us share the inspiring stories of God at work in His world.

SO THAT THE WORD OF GOD MAY SPREAD AND BE GLORIFIED

with Langham Global Coordinator for Preaching Groups Development, Dionisio Orjuela

Dionisio Orjuela is the newly appointed Langham Global Coordinator for Preaching Groups Development. He lives and works in his home country of Colombia. Dionisio first heard about Langham Partnership 25 years ago through his friend, Jorge. He reflects, "Jorge Atiencia, inspired by John Stott, invited me to be part of a group of pastors who became the first escuelitas (preaching clubs) coordinators. Then through Igor Améstegui, our continental director for Latin America, we got to know about Langham Preaching."

Growth in ministry and responsibility

By the grace of God, this and the broader Langham Preaching ministry has grown. Dionisio reflects, "This ministry has been established in 10 [Latin American] nations, with only 2 missing to reach the entire region."

In July 2024 Dionisio was invited to take up a new role as the Global Coordinator for Preaching Groups Development for Langham Partnership. Dionisio has a particular passion for preaching group development, having seen them work powerfully in Latin America.





He shares, "Based on the experience in Latin America, for more than 20 years, we have discovered that one of the pillars to sustain, maintain and grow a preaching movement are the escuelitas (preaching clubs). Without them, Langham preaching becomes nothing more than preaching events. The preaching groups help make it truly a preaching movement."

Better preaching and faithful preachers

After more than 11 years of doing ministry with Langham Partnership in Colombia and Central America, it is extremely gratifying for Dionisio to see how God has and is working through his peers and the preaching participants!

Dionisio shares, "Personally speaking Langham Preaching has helped me to be a better preacher...As a pastor, Langham has helped me to build a team of collaborators who have been trained in escuelitas and are the people who share the pastoral and preaching ministry with me."

Of his new role as Global Coordinator for Preaching Groups, Dionisio says, "My commitment and my dream in my new role is to inspire, support and accompany the national and continental teams. So that each preaching movement in the nations where they already exist and in those where they are going to be established, initiates, maintains and strengthens the ministry of preaching groups, which in turn, nourish and strengthen the preaching movements, all of this so that just as the apostle Paul longed for: "... the Word of the Lord may spread and be glorified, just as it was among you," (2 Thessalonians 3.1)."

SEEING REALITY IN THE PAGES OF THE BIBLE

with Mauricio Solis

Pastor Mauricio Solis has been serving in Costa Rica for the past 23 years. Previously a psychologist, now he is at the forefront of leading his congregation at West Abundant Life Church in San José. The publication of the Latin American Bible Commentary has shaped his teaching and his ministry.

The gospel preached to everyone

West Abundant Life Church is located in the west of San José in an area of major growth. It's in a middle-class community, but also very close to two very poor neighbourhoods. This brings two worlds together often in the church.



Mauricio explains, "I have passion for the social things, for the deprived people, the ill, and I started to preach to addicted people. And they started to come."

This tension between people's circumstances is an ongoing challenge in their context. However, it doesn't dampen Mauricio's heart to see all people hear the good news of Jesus and be welcomed into fellowship with Him and His people. For Mauricio, good contextual preaching is at the heart of this!



Resourcing pastors and people

Mauricio appreciates how the commentary gives him such a clear social context for his preaching. He explains, "The explanation of the Bible in this commentary comes from people that know my reality and help me to understand—with different eyes, but with the same culture. When I read this commentary, it's like I put on the glasses of Latin America to read about Latin America, to preach to my Latin American context and needs. I don't have any other way to get information like this."

From Latin America to the world

There is so much the global Church can learn from each other, and Mauricio sees the Latin American Church as a rich community with much to share.

He says, "I believe that the Church in Latin America can offer to [the Western] Church transformation through looking at how we live life with simplicity, doing a lot with very few resources. Looking at the courage of people facing risk and facing danger and expressing their own faith and this sense of community, of communion that we have. I also think we have learned to depend on God."



AUSTRALIAN-SUPPORTED SCHOLAR UPDATE Joseph Byamukama



Joseph lives with his wife Daphne and two young sons in Kampala, the capital city of Uganda. Uganda has a population of just over 50 million people, 82% of whom identify as Christian. The Church in Uganda struggles with competing non-biblical worldviews that influence what Ugandan Christians believe.

Ministry and study

Joseph is a pastor-theologian and founder of Veracity Fount and the Fount Church Uganda. Veracity Fount is committed to equipping the Ugandan Church to be theologically sound and mission-minded.

They run small group training sessions, publish podcasts and host a theological library. Visit veracityfount.org to learn more, or hear Joseph himself describe what Veracity Fount does on YouTube @veracityfount.

Joseph is a gifted theologian. He received his Masters in Divinity from Gordon-Conwell seminary in the US and has been studying for his PhD through Ridley College in Melbourne since 2022, supported through Langham Partnership Australia. The topic of his PhD thesis is "Early Intertextual Christology: How Isaiah Shapes Jesus's Lordship in Acts".

Two of his examiners commented that his was one of the best PhD theses they have read!

Current projects

Veracity Fount's latest project is a docu-series called The Ugandan Gospel that will explore and respond to the alternative 'gospel' teachings rooted in the traditional African worldview prevalent in Ugandan churches, highlighting the power of God in saving sinners through His Son by His Spirit as revealed in Scripture.

The docu-series will analyse five common doctrines, examining their origins and impact considering biblical and historical theology. They aim to deepen discipleship and evangelism by clarifying the gospel and stressing the sufficiency and supremacy of the gospel of Christ over any other means of salvation suggested by African traditional viewinfluenced teachings in Ugandan Churches.

They would love to expand the series to cover Sub-Saharan Africa but that depends on whether or not they can secure funding. However, the issues they cover in Uganda are pertinent to Christianity on most of the continent.

We are delighted to welcome Joseph and Daphne to Australia in late March/early April to celebrate Joseph's graduation at Ridley and give some of our supporters an opportunity to hear him speak.

Learning from the ministry of Ronald and our brothers and sisters in Myanmar

Recently, CEO Gillean visited Langham Graduate Ronald in Myanmar. Here is her reflection on his context and work.

My time in Myanmar in February this year gave me greater insight into the difficulties of Christian leaders working to help the church grow in maturity. It is not easy to provide the resources and

opportunities for learning that they would wish to have available, even as they operate in a context of economic and social pressure.

Despite the challenges for Myanmar Christians, my overwhelming impression was of a generous, gracious and committed people, faithfully and courageously witnessing to their Lord. And how encouraging it was to see firsthand the leadership and ministry of Ronald, a Langham Scholar who studied for his PhD here in Australia and is now Principal of the Myanmar Evangelical Graduate School of Theology (MEGST).

He is a wonderful example of the fruit of a Langham Scholarship, as he not only supports preaching ministry and leads and teaches in the theological seminary, but also continues to write. His current project is to complete the first ever Biblical Theology in the Chin language, targeted at ordinary Christians in the churches as well as students.

Ronald is introducing new courses to MEGST this year, to cater for the growing demand and expanded student body, and also has personally supervised many of the Doctor of Divinity candidates.

I thank God for the opportunity to travel to Myanmar and walk for a short time beside my brothers and sisters who are embodying the vision of Langham Partnership!
