

Chair's Report



In a time of such great uncertainty and unrest in so much of the world, we are grateful that the work of the Langham Partnership continues to bless the God's church in so many places.

This has been another busy year for us in Australia. In particular we were so glad to finally be able to announce Langham Literature Australia, an entity which has been granted Deductible Gift Recipient status for part of the work we do. A lot of work went into the submission for this: it is not something to be taken for granted. We pray that with this new entity in place, alongside our long-time Langham Partnership Australia, new opportunities to approach Charitable Foundations will enable our work to grow further.

As I write this in April 2025, it has been a delight in recent weeks to accompany Joseph Byamukama and his lovely wife Daphne, to the conferring of Joseph's PhD at Ridley College, Melbourne. Joseph is a man of great vision and energy who has a thriving and growing ministry in his home city of Kampala, Uganda, and he had the opportunity to meet some of our donors in Perth, Adelaide and Sydney as well as in Melbourne.

Our scholar Crystal is waiting for the results of her PhD, and we are very glad to have a new scholar, Emmy Veererasethsiri commencing her PhD through Sydney Missionary and Bible College. We look forward to visits from other parts of our international Langham family during this year. The Regional Co-ordinators for Langham Preaching Asia will meet in Sydney, including Tukana from Fiji who now leads our work in the Pacific. We are hopeful for opportunities to meet Tukana and some of the other participants, as well as Lina Toth, Langham Scholars Director, when she also visits Australia in July, from her home in Scotland.

Mostly I want to say that we are so grateful to our faithful donors and prayer supporters who continue to make this work possible, by the grace of God. It was a special privilege to receive a couple of generous bequests during this year, which reminded me of what an important ongoing impact gifts in this form can make.

Perhaps this is something that you could consider. And please do pray for us and for all those who labour for the Lord in places of great difficulty, and for us to wisely support them in all that they do.

The Langham Scholars program seeks to develop Majority World theological teachers by providing doctoral scholarships for those who will lead churches and train the next generation of pastors and Bible teachers in their home countries.

During FY24, Dr Lina Toth from Lithuania assumed the role of Director of the Scholars program. Although she continues to care for some scholars in Continental Europe and Central Asia, the majority of her time is dedicated to leadership and management of the Scholars program.

Consultations for Current Scholars

Scholar consultations help to provide training, networking, community, fellowship and encouragement to Scholars studying for their PhD. In FY24, three in-person and one online regional Scholar consultations were held, along with four in-person informal gatherings.



Graduating Scholars

Seven Scholars graduated with their PhDs, equipped to serve the church in their nations. Three of the Scholars who graduated are from sensitive countries - in the Middle East, SE Asia and East Asia - so we can't name them or their countries. Here are the others who graduated - four African men! All seven returned to serve in the Majority World.





Serge-Armand YaoCote d'Ivoire

Thesis title: A study of the salience of Jewish ethnicity in the Masoretic text of Esther by the interactional approach of Goffmanian inspiration. Lessons for the Evangelical CMA Protestant Church of Cote d'Ivoire.

Serge-Armand has been appointed as a full-time Professor of Old Testament at the School of Theology at the Université de l'Alliance Chrétienne d'Abidjan (UACA), Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire, and has also been entrusted with overseeing the works department of the University, including the UACA rental building. He is the Co-Regional Director of the Lausanne Movement for Francophone Africa and he also works as Quality Assurance Consultant for the Association for Christian Theological Education in Africa.



John Wega Kenya

Thesis title: Conflict and Cohesion: The Practice of "Giciaro" and its Significance to the Christian-Muslim Relations in Igembe, Meru County, Kenya

John remained in Kenya while working on his PhD studies on a split-site basis with OCMS, UK, generally undertaking residencies in the UK for up to two months each year. Alongside his study program, John continued to teach at St Andrew's Theological College, Kabare, Kenya, and he remains in this position now that he has completed his PhD. He also serves as an Assistant Pastorat St Peter's Cathedral, Siakago, and as a Chaplain at Kenyatta National Hospital.



Emmanuel Ndikumana Burundi

Thesis title: Transforming Destructive Ethnic Violence: An Exploration of the Role of Forgiveness in Political Reconciliation in Burundi. He studied at Oxford Centre for Mission Studies, UK

Emmanuel's Supervisor, Dr Everett Worthington, commented, "Emmanuel struggled long and hard to complete this work while living as a practical mediator and activist within Burundi. It is a great work of balance of the theological, psychological, and practical."



Samuel Sarkodie-Addo Ghana

Thesis title: Church and Politics: A Case Study of the Engagement Between Some Selected Churches and Christian Politicians for the Promotion of Good Governance in Ghana. He studied at: Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), Ghana

After completing his PhD, Samuel returned to his full-time role as Administrator for his church, St George's Church, Kumasi. He is also in a parttime lecturing position at Christian Service University College in Chana where he is teaching an undergraduate course and one at Masters level. In addition to these responsibilities, he is involved in the work of the Institute of Christian Impact (ICI) in Ghana (which started in 2024) and he will continue to be involved as a trainer with Langham Preaching Ghana, helping to mobilise trainees. Samuel is keen to write journal articles and books on theological and practical issues affecting the church and also with a national or global perspective, especially focused on leadership, governance, Christian impact, stewardship and witness.



Langham Preaching works in fellowship with national leaders to establish local and national preaching movements for pastors and lay preachers all around the world. Together we provide practical on-site support for pastors and lay preachers, organise multi-level training seminars focusing on practical, biblically-based training, and provide resources. Preachers are equipped to faithfully study and teach God's Word so they can shepherd congregations with hope in Christ.

Pastor Tukana Nakesu from Fiji took on the position of Regional Coordinator for Langham Preaching in the South Pacific, with support from Rev Stephen Williams, the previous Coordinator. Tukana's appointment reflects Langham's goal for each Preaching movement worldwide to be led by local, indigenous leaders.



Langham Literature provides Majority World pastors, scholars and seminary libraries with evangelical books and electronic resources. We also foster the creation of indigenous biblical books for pastors in many languages, through training workshops for writers and editors, sponsoring writers, translation, strengthening local evangelical publishing houses, and investment in major regional literature projects, such as one-volume Bible commentaries.

In 2024...

11,159

biblical books were supplied to 713 Majority World colleges across 85 countries to help students grow and mature in Christ. 9,590 of these books were supplied to 703 colleges free of charge through the Library Grants program!

68,865

Bible-centred books were distributed to Majority World pastors, students and ministry partners in need of study materials. 15,462 of these books were supplied free of charge to participants at, or Coordinators of, Langham Preaching seminars and/or clubs.

219,563

books were distributed, including books that Langham distributes for ministry partners. Of the total books distributed by Langham, 89,325 (40%) were digital.

38

books were published, including 15 Langham Global Library, 20 Langham Academic, 2 Hippobooks and 1 LivresHippo books (Hippo books are for Francophone Africa). 34 of the books published were by MW authors or contributors, and 10 of these were by Langham Scholars.

182

Majority World writers were mentored and/or trained and some Majority World Editors.

28

Langham Literature was actively involved with 28 indigenous publishers, in 23 different countries, in the production of 61 local language titles, through the awarding of Publisher Grants (to 24 publishers in 16 countries), and/or mentoring and advice. Additionally, 11 local writers in 8 countries were supported through Writer Grants.



The South Asia Bible Commentary in Urdu


For Langham Literature, 2024 was a year of much work on Bible commentaries!

There are 14 Bible commentaries in process, but only one was completed and published in 2024: the South Asia Bible Commentary in Urdu. Urdu (along with English) is the official language of Pakistan.

Pakistan, officially the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, is a vast nation of over 241 million people, where over three million, or 1.37% of the population, identify as Christian.

Persecution of Christians in Pakistan has been recorded since the country's independence in 1947. The persecution has taken many forms, including violence and discrimination, and results from a number of factors, including religious extremism, sectarian violence, and the country's blasphemy laws. Religious extremism is on the rise in Pakistan, and Christian churches and schools have been targeted in attacks. (Information from Wikipedia, 2024)

Langham Partnership is active in Pakistan, but because it is a sensitive country, we do not publicise our work there.

Langham Literature Australia – a tax-deductible way to give to Langham

We're so grateful for the generous financial support for Langham Partnership by so many Australians over the years. Your financial partnership has enabled our programs in the Majority World to double in scope and impact over the past five years, and we look forward to continuing to deliver at this level, with God's gracious provision through supporters such as you.

In 2024, a change to our structure enabled us to achieve Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) status with the Australian Tax Office. This is something that we had sought for quite some time and it was wonderful to finally achieve it!

Some gifts are now eligible for a tax deduction. Relevant projects are any that come under the heading of **Langham Literature** (such as a new Bible Commentary, or book distribution to colleges). Also eligible is Scholar work that is designed to produce a written text. However, "Literature" is not confined to the written text, so the production of our podcast *Out of the Margins* also qualifies.

Please ask us if you would like the details on the structural changes that have enabled this development. From the supporter's perspective, all that has changed is that some gifts will now be identified as being tax-deductible, and those gifts are deposited into a different bank account. When we receive these gifts, we issue you the usual receipt, but at the end of the financial year we will issue you a tax receipt for all tax-deductible gifts given through that financial year.

We hope our regular supporters will continue to donate as they're currently doing. We still depend heavily upon unrestricted gifts to allocate funds to where they're most needed.

However, we hope that having tax-deductible gifts will encourage new donors and that we can apply for grants to some foundations that require DGR status.

We'll notify you when we're seeking funds for a tax-deductible purpose, and also remind you of the separate bank details for tax-deductible gifts. All other gifts will be allocated according to your wishes or "where most needed", and should be directed to the same bank account we have always used.

Please pray that God will use this new status to help continue to grow Langham's ministry!

A message from the CEO



As we develop the Strategic Plan to take us to 2030 and beyond, we are now focused on maintaining that growth as well as developing our Programs to continue to respond to the increasing demand and need for our services. 


