## TEACHING SOLID THEOLOGY, STEWARDSHIP AND BIBLICAL PRACTICE IN GHANA

with Samuel Sarkodie-Addo

Samuel Sarkodie-Addo lives in Ghana and started Langham Preaching training in 2009 when working with Ghana Fellowship of Evangelical Students. After completing all the three levels of Langham Preaching training and doing the Training the Trainers course, he applied and received a Langham Scholarship in 2019 after completing his Masters in Religious Studies. He completed his PhD in 2023 at Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology in Ghana and is now a university lecturer, author and works at his local church.

Samuel wrote his PhD on 'Church and Politics: A study of the political engagement between some selected churches and Christian politicians for the promotion of good governance in Ghana.' His focus was to explore how churches are engaging their members who are into politics with faith, and draw on resource utilisation and stewardship to better equip Christians to engage faithfully and have a meaningful impact.

#### A supportive network

When Samuel started his PhD, he also started work full-time at his church as an administrator, which he continues to do today. He is very grateful to Langham, and shares, "The scholarship program was extremely helpful. In terms of the financial assistance, it would have been very difficult for me if I had not had the scholarship from Langham... it helped me, helped my family, it reduced a lot of financial burden... it was extremely important for my journey."

Samuel also valued the scholar care through Langham, which sees a coordinator support the scholar holistically. He explains, "The support for my family; praying with me, encouraging me, and always checking up on how the family was doing was very helpful. I don't think we have that in a lot of scholarship schemes and it is unique to have that kind of pastoral counselling advisory and supporting role from the Scholar Carer".

#### Teaching and equipping

The support and training from Langham brought Samuel great opportunities as a teacher. In 2021 he was offered a lecturing role in Christian leadership at Christian Service University. In 2023, he was also appointed to teach Ethics in Communication Practice. Samuel has written and published 11 books, and gets invited to speak at conferences and churches. He also recently started an initiative in 'Stewardship Advocacy' and hopes to engage the whole country and continent of Africa about being good stewards with resources.

In Africa, Samuel describes Christian faith as "Miles wide and then an inch deep... as a practical theologian, I see that Africa has a lot of problems with regards to practice."

He explains, "Africans have not brought the Gospel to bear in our daily lives. Therefore there is an issue of theology—wrong theology, wrong foundation, which is influencing wrong practice. So for me that is what I seek to challenge. That is what I seek to do; how to bring the Bible into everyday practice, politics, governance, in management, institutions and everything... we cannot have good practice if we don't have strong theology."

#### Supporting the mission

Langham Partnership is equipping people all over the world to reach more people with the Gospel. Samuel shares, "Langham is a very strategic ministry; very important in the scheme of God's mission. If you look at the three key areas of scholarship, preaching and literature, these are very helpful. And I have benefited from all three, and I've been involved with all three. I would say that anyone who has the opportunity, should get involved whether through the [Preaching] training, through literature, and then through the scholarship or partnership, and also those who are willing to support so that Langham can continue. We are reaching a lot of people across the continents and the nations of the world, and I believe that a ministry that has integrity, that has credibility, and has a history of impacting, is worth supporting."

# FOLLOWING GOD'S CALL AND INSPIRING THE NEXT GENERATION IN CAIRO

Rania Hendy is from Cairo, Egypt. She received a Langham Scholarship in 2018 and has recently graduated with her PhD from Asbury Theological Seminary, Kentucky (US). She is a Professor in the Old Testament at the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Cairo (ETSC) and **is the first evangelical woman in Egypt and the Middle East to have a PhD in this field!** 

#### Pursuing her calling against the odds

Rania graduated with a Masters of Divinity in 2005, and her Master's of Theology in 2007 and felt called to further her studies with a PhD. She knew it was going to be a challenge, she shares, "The tuition is extremely high for us. I always felt the need to do my PhD, but I knew that it was impossible because a married woman here in Egypt cannot leave her family and go for a long time to study. Nobody would understand that."

She was given the contact of Langham Partnership, and after what she thought was a phone call to ask for a college recommendation she was sent the application to apply for a Scholarship. The opportunity to apply for the scholarship was an answered prayer.

She shares, "I started to pray in this direction and I said, Lord, it's really hard to leave my husband all of that time. So I need real confirmation from you, to clarify for me and my husband that this is the right direction and this is the right time. And Langham was one of the great confirmations from the Lord."

#### God opened the doors

Rania studied the Old Testament, and for her dissertation she wrote about Isaiah from chapters 40 to 55. Her PhD is titled, 'Second Isaianic mirroring of the creative imagination of Yahweh in light of the philosophical imagination of Samuel Taylor Coleridge'.

Rania shares, "Isaiah had a very highly imaginative mind as they described him. But they don't explain 'What do they mean by imaginative mind?' So I took it from there and started to study about the philosophy of imagination."



#### Using her gifts to inspire the next generation of women and men

Since completing her studies, God has opened many opportunities for Rania. She shares, "Having a PhD does not only enable me to lecture in the seminary, but it opens many doors. From the time I returned back, I have been invited to many seminars outside of the seminary, involved in panel discussions and in big conferences... I try to be a role model for other women. Our seminary is not small...but we have a lot of women now. I try to inspire them, but also inspire men when I tell the story about how my husband was supporting me, because he felt like we, together, are fulfilling God's call."

Rania is grateful for the Langham scholarship, not just financially as she would not have been able to complete her PhD without it, but also for the care and support with the provision of a mentor during her studies. She shares, "I'm really so grateful...I wouldn't have been able to impact so many lives as I'm doing now. Langham doesn't only support me financially, they've been supporting me spiritually as well. I have a mentor and he's been with me during the whole process, encouraging me, praying with me, coming to visit me every year at Asbury. It's kind of like they are trying to take care of everything, including your own spiritual life because the journey is hard; psychologically, physically, spiritually, so that's the holistic pastoral care. I'm so blessed to be part of Langham."

## HELPING TO EQUIP PASTORS IN SOUTHERN AFRICA TO TEACH THE BIBLE FAITHFULLY

Johannes Mtumo Mngomezulu lives in Eswatini in Southern Africa, and is the leading pastor at his local church. He is also the National Chairperson for Langham Preaching.



Johannes was introduced to Langham by his brother, and after learning about the ministry he was "hooked" straight away. He shares, "I had just completed my Bachelor of Arts in Theology, and then as he was explaining about Langham, I was so hooked by the fact that they actually teach on how to preach biblical truth from the Bible."

#### The need for biblical truth

He shares, "What we see here in Eswatini is that more emphasis in the pulpit is the healing gospel and also the prosperity gospel...Langham brought back the biblical truths in the pulpit that should be preached, rather than making emphasis on the prosperity and the healing gospel."

"When I was doing Langham level one, I realised that Langham is actually bringing a simple model that enables you to just get the right message from the passage."

As a pastor in his local church, Johannes uses the expository preaching method, and uses what he learned through the Langham training, "I employ much more of the model that I learned from Langham rather than what I learned from college, because with this model from Langham, it's a shortened version of what I learned in the college. It's more practical," he explains.



#### **Teaching and equipping**

Johannes also works for the Faith Bible College, and has introduced Langham Partnership to the students. Over 200 pastors have completed various levels of the training, and are in local Preaching Clubs. He shares, "That's where we keep the fire...so that after doing level one, they don't go back home and they forget about everything...We meet every first Sunday of the month, we have literature that we get from Langham, and sometimes we read through the books...Or we get into a passage from the Bible where we read the passage together and then we look into what God is saying in the passage."

Johannes is passionate about helping pastors be trained to teach the Bible faithfully and relevantly. He shares, "Our main dream is that as we preach here in Eswatini we need to preach one message from the pulpit. We have seen Langham help us through that, because we bring pastors, as many pastors as possible for Langham training. Our feeling is that the thereafter [the pastors] will be preaching basic biblical truths. That truth has to actually help the people change their way of living, change their character, change their behaviour. That's what we're looking for."


# Book Club LAUNCH

Our first Young Langham Book Club has just wrapped up reading and discussing their first book, Breakfast on the Beach written by Johannes Van der Bijl. Every two months Club members will read and discuss online a book written by a Langham Scholar or author and if possible the author will join the final online call to speak about the book and to answer questions.

One of the Club members, Cameron, shares his experience of the Book Club, "The Langham Book Club was advertised at my church, and I joined because I wanted to expand my Christian reading and thought that the Book Club would give me a deeper understanding of the books we were reading."

"After reading the book, I most enjoyed having the opportunity to speak with the author and understand the motivations and thought processes he used to write on certain topics. I enjoyed Breakfast on the Beach very much. I was a bit sceptical about a book that introduced extra-biblical themes, but I thought it was done very thoughtfully. I enjoyed the incorporation of historical research with the gospel story. Describing the disciples' emotional reactions in certain situations gave a richer context to the story."

"I am looking forward to expanding my understanding of my Christian journey and once again interacting with the author of the [next] book. I think the Book Club is a great experience that helps expand your understanding and encourages you in your Christian journey."
